COMPLAINT FOR VIOLATION OF
OAKLAND'S JUST CAUSE
ORDINANCE, INJUNCTIVE RELIEF,
AND OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF

1 The People of the State of California as Plaintiff and the City of Oakland, as
2 Plaintiff and Real Party, hereinafter "Plaintiff" allege against Defendants FIDELITY
3 NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK,
4 ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, MARCO RODRIGUEZ, and DOES 1 through 20,
5 hereinafter "Defendants", and each of them, as follows:

6 1. Plaintiff, the City of Oakland, is a municipal corporation and a
7 chartered city, organized and existing under the laws of the State of California.

8 2. Defendant FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL'S affiliates FIDELITY
9 NATIONAL FINANCIAL TITLE GROUP and SERVICELINK provide centralized title and
10 closing services to national lenders. ASSETLINK, an affiliate of SERVICELINK, offers
11 asset management and disposition services, with the goal to liquidate their customers'
12 inventory quickly and with the most favorable terms. Defendant FIDELITY NATIONAL
13 FINANCIAL has a business office in Santa Ana, California. Defendant SERVICELINK
14 maintains multiple business offices in California. Defendants FIDELITY FINANCIAL TITLE
15 GROUP and ASSETLINK are incorporated in the state of California and have business
16 offices in California. Defendants currently do business in Oakland, California as
17 ASSETLINK.

18 3. Defendant STACI CAMPOS is a California licensed real estate agent,
19 with a principal place of business in El Sobrante, California. STACI CAMPOS currently
20 does business in Oakland, California. During all times relevant to this complaint, STACI
21 CAMPOS acted as an employee and/or agent of Defendant ASSETLINK.

22 4. Defendant MARCO RODRIGUEZ is a California licensed real estate
23 agent, with a principal place of business in El Sobrante, California. MARCO RODRIGUEZ
24 currently does business in Oakland, California. During all times relevant to this

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1 complaint, MARCO RODRIGUEZ acted as an employee and/or agent of Defendant
2 ASSETLINK.

3 5. Venue is proper in Alameda County because the actions that give rise
4 to the allegations occurred at properties in Oakland, California, a city in Alameda County.

5 6. Defendants DOES 1 through 20 are sued as fictitious names, their
6 names and capacities being unknown to Plaintiff. When their true names and capacities
7 are ascertained, Plaintiff will amend this complaint.

8 7. Whenever reference is made to an act performed by Defendants
9 such allegations include the Defendants, their agents, managers, representatives,
10 employees or DOES 1 through 20 who performed or authorized such acts while engaged
11 in the operation, management, direction or control of the Defendants' affairs, and acting
12 within the scope of their duties.

13 **PRELIMINARY ALLEGATIONS**

14 8. Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL
15 TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, and MARCO
16 RODRIGUEZ provide eviction/foreclosure services as part of their real estate business
17 operations.

18 9. Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL
19 TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, and MARCO
20 RODRIGUEZ achieve sales of vacant foreclosed properties by violating Oakland's Just
21 Cause Ordinance (Oakland Municipal Code Sections 8.22.300 through 8.22.390).
22 Plaintiffs are informed and believe and on that basis allege that tenants are ousted from
23 their homes by Defendants because a vacant home is more marketable and easier to sell.
24 Defendants' violations of the ordinance, include but are not limited to: 1) initiation of the
25 eviction process without a specific just cause ground; 2) providing written eviction notices
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1 that do not state a just cause ground, 3) failing to advise tenants of the Just Cause
2 Ordinance or the tenant's right to seek advice from the Oakland Rent Board; and 4) failing
3 to file copies of eviction notices served on the tenant with the Oakland Rent Board.

4 10. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based on such information and
5 belief alleges that Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL
6 TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, and MARCO
7 RODRIGUEZ have violated tenants' rights and the Just Cause Ordinance in eviction
8 proceedings initiated at 2125 - 2127 45th Avenue, in Oakland, California. Plaintiff is
9 informed and believes, and based on such information and belief alleges that Defendants
10 FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK,
11 and ASSETLINK violated tenants' rights and the Just Cause Ordinance in eviction
12 proceedings initiated at 1003 62nd Street, in Oakland, California.

13 11. Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL
14 TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, and MARCO
15 RODRIGUEZ employ scare tactics through misleading language contained in the
16 standardized and illegal eviction notice that they serve on tenants. The notice advises
17 tenants that property ownership has been transferred and they must vacate the premises,
18 and that failure to contact the broker within 48 hours will result in the initiation of legal
19 action; acts which are plainly prohibited by state law governing eviction procedure or
20 predicated upon a lawful eviction proceeding being initiated. Such actions also violate
21 Oakland's Just Cause Ordinance.

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1 FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

2 (Against Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL
3 TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, MARCO RODRIGUEZ,
4 and DOES 1 THROUGH 20 – Violation of Oakland’s Just Cause
5 Ordinance [Oakland Municipal Code Sections 8.22.300-390])

6 12. Plaintiff incorporates by reference Paragraphs 1 through 11 as
7 though fully set forth herein.

8 13. The City of Oakland brings this action pursuant to Section 401(6) of
9 the Oakland City Charter, which authorizes the City Attorney to commence an action to
10 abate or remove a violation and restrain and enjoin any person from violating any
11 provisions of the Municipal Code, or other applicable laws, rules, and regulations. The
12 City Attorney is additionally empowered to enforce Oakland’s Just Cause Ordinance
13 pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code Section 8.22.370.

14 14. Oakland’s Just Cause Ordinance (Municipal Code Sections 8.22.300
15 through 8.22.390), provides multiple safeguards to tenant renters in the City of Oakland.
16 Protective elements of the ordinance include, *inter alia*, requirements that:

- 17 • a property owner must have just cause in order to evict (8.22.360(A));
- 18 • a written eviction notice must advise a tenant of the applicable just
19 cause ground, the Just Cause Ordinance and the tenant’s right to
20 seek advice from the Oakland Rent Board (8.22.360(B)); and
- 21 • copies of eviction notices must be filed with the Oakland Rent Board
22 within 10 days of service on a tenant (8.22.360(B)).

23 15. Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL
24 TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, and MARCO
25 RODRIGUEZ have violated the Just Cause Ordinance at least as to the initiation of the
26 eviction process at 2125-2127 45th Avenue, and 1003 62nd Street, Oakland, California.
Plaintiff is informed and believes that Defendants violated the Just Cause Ordinance at

1 other, as yet unascertained, locations as well. These violations include, but are not limited
2 to: 1) initiating the eviction process without just cause; 2) providing written eviction notices
3 that do not i) state a just cause ground, ii) advise tenants of the Just Cause Ordinance or
4 iii) advise tenants of their right to seek advice from the Oakland Rent Board; and 3) failing
5 to file copies of eviction notices with the Oakland Rent Board within 10 days of service on
6 the tenant.

7 16. Wherefore, Plaintiff seeks relief as hereinafter set forth.

8 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

9 **(Against Defendants FIDELITY NATIONAL FINANCIAL, FIDELITY NATIONAL**
10 **TITLE GROUP, SERVICELINK, ASSETLINK, STACI CAMPOS, MARCO RODRIGUEZ,**
11 **and DOES 1 THROUGH 20 – Injunctive Relief**
12 **[Temporary Restraining Order, Preliminary and Permanent Injunctions])**

13 17. Plaintiff incorporates by reference Paragraphs 1 through 16 as
14 though fully set forth herein.

15 18. Defendants' wrongful conduct, unless and until enjoined and
16 restrained by order of this court, will cause great and irreparable injury to Plaintiff. During
17 the pendency of the instant lawsuit, Defendants' on-going violations of Oakland's Just
18 Cause Ordinance will cause harm to the City of Oakland through repeated and unchecked
19 violations of its municipal code. Tenants within the City of Oakland will also continue to be
20 subjected to Defendants' illegal "disposition procedures" during the pendency of litigation.

21 19. Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law for the injuries currently being
22 suffered, and that are threatened. Pecuniary compensation will not afford adequate relief
23 from the unceasing violations of Oakland's municipal code and the resulting displacement
24 of tenants and their families from their lawful dwellings (Civ. Code § 3422(1)).

25 20. Wherefore, Plaintiff seeks relief as hereinafter set forth.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment as follows:

1. That pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code §§ 8.22.370(C), and Civil Code § 1942.4, Defendants be ordered to pay Plaintiff's actual damages, costs and attorney's fees.

2. That pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code § 8.22.370(C), and the court's inherent equity powers, Defendants, and each of them, and their employees, agents, salesmen, representatives, successors, assigns and all other persons, corporations or other entities acting under, by, through or on behalf of said Defendants, or acting in concert or participation with or for them with actual or constructive notice of this injunction, be permanently enjoined from violating the provisions of Oakland's Just Cause Ordinance (Oakland Municipal Code §§ 8.22.300 - 8.22.390) including, but not limited to, the violations alleged in this complaint.

3. That pursuant to the court's inherent equity powers, Defendants, and each of them, be ordered to allow tenants evicted by Defendants' unlawful actions to be restored to their prior residence. Alternatively, if tenants have already found a new residence, or Defendants are unable to restore tenants to their prior residence, that Defendants, and each of them, be ordered to pay the moving expenses and costs of tenants.

4. That pursuant to the court's inherent equity powers, Defendants, and each of them, be ordered to reimburse tenants for any other expenses incurred as a result of Defendants' unlawful attempts to evict or evictions.

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5. That Plaintiff has such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require and the court deems appropriate and just.
